We require our employees at our managed properties to complete compulsory training relating to slavery, human trafficking amongst other topics and make this training available to all our franchisees. We are not aware of any labour malpractice being reported on the premises of Wyndham branded hotels in Qatar, or any other Wyndham branded properties across the world."
