

TheSocialWork Recruitment will not tolerate any behaviour which undermines the rights and freedoms of other human beings. We are committed to acting ethically and in our business endeavours and place the same expectations on all our partner organisations.

WHAT WE ARE DOING DO COMBAT MODERN SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

- 1) We have a Modern Slavery Policy which sets out behaviour expected from employees. This policy is disseminated to all our business partners.
- 2) We also have a Whistleblowing Policy which enables our employees to any report any suspicious activity and ill-treatment of colleagues within the work place.
- 3) All our candidates go through rigorous vetting which includes meeting them face to face, verification of legal documentation and right to work status.
- 4) We are committed to offering training opportunities to ensure a high level of awareness on modern slavery and human trafficking amongst our employees and workforce.
- 5) If the supplier is required to comply with the Modern Slavery Act 2015, we will review their own published policies on modern slavery.

In making this statement, we are demonstrating that we support the eradication of slavery in all its forms from all parts of our business and supply chains.
