

**Public Statement**  
**June 14<sup>th</sup> 2021**

After 48 days from the starting point of the National Strike, those who have been part of the mobilizations and we recognized the Andiamazonic Regional Strike Committee, representing the most humble and marginalized social sectors of the region; who every day live in our own flesh multiple violations to the territory and the communities due to that idea of development and dominant economic progress that is implemented in Colombia; those of us who have the strength of the “*juntanza*” and all the ancestral wisdom; Those of us who shoulder to shoulder demand dignity to be able to live in our country, we communicate that:

1. During the 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> of June, we have advanced in the dialogues with the National government<sup>1</sup>, with the objective of opening a window to the negotiation of a guarantee route for the social protest that for now contains 16 points to be agreed. Today, June 14<sup>th</sup>, we managed to debate some of them, one has to do with the urgency that the Governorates of Putumayo, Nariño and Cauca, as well as the municipalities of these departments which have been active in public demonstrations, implement the provisions of Decree 03 of 2021, referring to the guarantees for social protest. The other is related to the need not to make use of the military assistance figure issued by the national government, through decree 575 of 2021.

2. Our intention so that, once the will for the enjoyment of these guarantees has been expressed, the Dialogue Table be installed to deal with the Regional Request Rout, with the coordination of other high-level entities of the national government.

3. Advances will be made in the dialogues with the oil companies, in relation to the guarantees of non-judicialization, a parallel scenario to the dialogue of Guarantees installed with the national government headed by the Minister of Mines and Energy Diego Mesa.
