I write in connection with your email communication to us on 28 June 2021 regarding the report by the International Work Group for Indigenous Affaris (IWGIA) & Indigenous Peoples Rights International (IPRI). I am happy to respond on behalf of BP, in my capacity as VP Social Sustainability.

Thank you for bringing this report to our attention, we are committed to applying the UNGPs and to respecting the rights of indigneous peoples. The Oxfam 2015 survey referenced our 2013 Human Rights policy, which stated our commitment to respect the human rights of all people but did not call out specific groups. We updated our human rights policy in 2020. The revised policy clarifies and expands on our commitments or approach in a number of important areas – for example, on respecting the rights of indigenous peoples and following international standards when consulting them on our planned activities. Three of bp's major production sites, in Indonesia, Australia and the US are located where indigenous peoples are present.

Thank you again for your communication; BP will continue to engage contructively in discussion with BHRRC.
