Dear Ms. Zbona,

Let me start by referring to Oxfam America's open letter dated 10 January forwarded to Equinor 17 January by the Business & Human Rights Resource Centre, London.

The letter invites 29 EITI Supporting Companies, including companies on the EITI Board like Equinor, to answer a series of questions related to the Expectations for EITI supporting companies (Expectations).

As you are aware, the EITI Board is currently in the process of discussing revisions to the Expectations, as well as how to deal with situations where a company is not meeting the Expectations. This in an effort to find a consensus solution. Given this ongoing process, and in line with regular principles for EITI board governance and work, we do not deem it appropriate nor necessarily in the interest of identifying workable solutions, to provide more detailed responses to the questions posed in the open letter.

To the extent you are interested in Equinor's payments to governments reporting, we invite you to study our latest Annual Report, section 5.4, which can be found on our webpages (<u>Annual Reports - equinor.com</u>). Similarly, you will also find our latest Annual Sustainability Report providing more information about our approach to governance and sustainability in general.
