Subject: Iberdrola's response to Story: Imposition of the Cerro de Hula wind project on the territories of various communities

Madrid, 7st February 2023

Dear sir/madam,

Iberdrola has no operations in Honduras, neither an operating or financial stake in the the Cerro de Hula wind project.

In relation to the aforementioned story, Iberdrola would like to make the following statement.

This story includes our company as one of the major owners of the Cerro de Hula wind project. Far from been accurate, Iberdrola has not a stake in its ownership. Honduras is not a country of operation of Iberdrola Group.

The only relationship that Iberdrola Group established with that project was that it participated together with many other companies in the construction of the wind park through one of its subsidiaries (former Iberdrola Ingeniería y Construcción*), being in charge of the engineering, procurement, construction and commissioning of it. In addition, it carried out an electrical substation and a 40-kilometer line for the evacuation of the energy generated.

Acting just as a contractor for the project, Iberdrola was not involved in the compulsory expropriation or any of the other procedures referred to in the history, which corresponded exclusively to the company promoting the project.

Therefore, we kindly request that that you please state explicitly in our response to it that "Iberdrola denies having any stake in the wind project referred to in the story".

^{*} Iberdrola Ingeniería y Construcción was the engineering arm of Iberdrola. It was dissolved and nowadays the reduced activity of the subsidiary is linked to some maintenance obligations that should be attended during the life of the facility.
