Thank you for your letter to Chairman and CEO John Watson dated June 23, 2015. We appreciate the opportunity to discuss these important issues.

Chevron, through our subsidiary Unocal Myanmar Offshore Co., Ltd., was granted exploration rights in a block located offshore Myanmar in March this year. Unocal Myanmar Offshore Co., Ltd. will be the operator of the block with a 99 percent interest. Royal Marine Engineering, a Myanmar-based company, will hold the remaining interest in the block.

Chevron is committed to carrying out our business in a manner that respects human rights. To that end, Chevron enacted a Human Rights Policy in 2009 that applies to all of our operations and is consistent with the Voluntary Principles on Security and Human Rights, the United Nations Declaration of Human Rights, the International Labour Organization Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work, the International Finance Corporation's Performance Standard on Land Acquisition and Involuntary Resettlement, and the World Bank Operational Policy and Bank Procedure on Indigenous Peoples.

Chevron intends to fully comply with the U.S. Government's Burma Responsible Investment Reporting Requirements.
