This is 90 days from receipt of goods to our warehouse for origins close to our headquarters, and 90 days upon receipt of goods to our forwarder for origins further afield.
- 2. When is payment for orders typically made (i.e. after shipping, upon receipt of goods, partial payment in advance of production, etc.)? Payment is typically made 90 days after receipt of goods as per above.

Inditex has also worked proactively from the start of the pandemic both individually and alongside our key stakeholders focused on the protection of workers' rights, as further explained in point 11 below.

Where production is ongoing, have you taken steps to ensure suppliers are implementing measures to protect garment workers from infection (i.e. social distancing, sanitising practices, providing adequate protective equipment)? Y/N Yes. Inditex is committed to working with its suppliers through the impacts of Covid-19. Ensuring safe and healthy working conditions for workers is a key component of our supply chain management strategy. As a priority, we are working closely with suppliers to ensure they are following official guidance to protect the health and safety of workers in factories during the pandemic. For that reason, we have created guidelines based on WHO recommendations on health protection in work places during Covid 19 to ensure their implementation by suppliers. Furthermore, we are in touch with suppliers regarding any further health and safety recommendations specific to each country and intend to continue updating suppliers as the situation evolves.
- 10. Are you paying shareholder dividends? Y/N or N/A for companies without public shareholders Since the start or the pandemic the company has not paid shareholders dividends.

Inditex is committed to working with its suppliers through the impacts of Covid-19. Inditex has worked proactively since the beginning of the pandemic both individually and alongside our key stakeholders focused on the protection of workers' rights, such as IndustriALL Global Union – the international federation of unions with which we maintain a Global Framework Agreement, the International Labour Organization, Ethical Trading Initiative and ACT (Action, Collaboration, Transformation). Together with these and other organizations, we have focused our efforts on minimizing the impacts of COVID19 on workers and on continuing to ensure the sustainability of global supply chains in the future.

In particular, we have worked proactively in the creation of the "COVID-19: Action in the Global Garment Industry" coordinated by the International Labour Organization in collaboration with The International Organisation of Employers (IOE), the International Trade Union Confederation (ITUC), IndustriALL Global Union and other brands for support for manufacturers and workers through the economic disruption caused by Covid-19. This call to action commits us to collectively take action to protect garment workers' income, health and employment and support employers to survive during the COVID-19 crisis, and to work together to establish sustainable systems of social protection.

The call to action is working on the initial stages in following lines:

- 1. Working with governments and financial institutions to mobilise sufficient funding to keep manufacturers in business including payment of wages, as well as income-support and job-retention schemes to address the impact of the crisis.
- 2. Strengthen social protection systems and public infrastructure for social services in priority countries.
- 3. Promote respect for the ILO Core labour standards, as well as safe and healthy workplaces

Inditex has endorsed this call to action and is one of the 13 members of the International Working Group designated to ensure its implementation.

The initiative will focus on eight specific countries most in need, although others may also be included as provisional priority ones, based on further information and emerging needs.
