Jindal presented a resettlement action plan, which the government deserved special attention and was carefully evaluated in order to preserve the rights of affected communities.

Due to several factors the process lengthened beyond what is foreseen, in this, there was a mismatch with the plan of the start of production.

Several measures were taken in order to prevent the adverse effect of population from the very beginning of production.

We started with the trial production, where some regrets concerning dust and farms were registered in the communities nearest the mine.

On guideline of Environmental Department of Tete, new measures were recommended. Such as:

- ☒ Mounting Controllers dust in the communities.
- ☒ Using of truck tank for systematic irrigation in the mine.
- ☒ Permanent monitoring of dust and other required measures.

Moreover, we use this opportunity to clarify that Jindal will not and neither did any of the temporary movement of affected communities, hoping to make the final relocation of the same by considering the impact that would result from this process.

Jindal received the Resettlement Action Plan approved by the government of Mozambique since the 6th of August 2013 and started immediate activities in coordination with government activities for compensation of affected farm .

All affected communities are entitled to farms, and technical works are taking place to ensure that we are providing suitable area for agriculture.

Implementation activities of the plan are already planned, and within few days we have measurable actions on the ground.

We will take this process in a transparent manner and compensate communities fairly
